2018/2019 ANNUAL REPORT





60 years ago, the Boys and Girls Club started in the Okanagan. It was the Boys Club then, and a place of safety, belonging and positive role models after school for kids who really needed us. The Club members who attended in the 50's and 60's remember those days fondly, and tell stories of boxing, woodworking and friendship.

Fast forward 60 years, and their grandchildren are attending our clubs today. The activities may be very different, but why kids come to the club is the same today as it was 60 years ago. The club is a safe place, a place to belong and build positive relationships. That's the foundation of Boys & Girls Clubs, and that hasn't changed in 60 years.

When you're in the club, you belong. It feels great to belong, to find a place where you are accepted for who you are, and have friends with common interests. To know that there are staff who care about you, and want to help you succeed. Sometimes growing up is full of challenges, some of which are difficult to imagine. But, we don't give up on kids and families. We believe

healthy emotional and social development in childhood is the foundation for mental health and resilience for life.

#### STRONG CLUBS

In 2019, we served 1,300 kids every day, and reached over 8,000 individuals. Our demand for services in communities has never been higher. We are challenged to keep up, and recruit enough staff. We continue to focus on providing high quality programs. We have worked hard as an organization to understand more about Truth and Reconciliation, about gender identity and about the impact of trauma on the people we serve. This year through Project Impact, we learned how important the club experience is to both our members and our team, and how we are making a positive difference in lives.

## STRONG VOICE

We have worked hard this year to amplify our voice in the community, and speak up about issues that impact the children, youth and families we work with. We have been contributing members of community coalitions and collaborations, ranging from Early Years to Youth Homelessness. We have worked with our colleagues across the province and country to influence decisions that are good for children. We are listening to what youth have to say.

#### STRONGER TOGETHER

We have a team of staff and volunteers who show up every day, with a smile on their face, ready to tackle whatever challenge they are faced with. We are focused on their growth and development. We are graduating our first group of Emerging Leaders, our 2 year leadership development program, and will do our 3rd intake in the fall. We have trained mentors and coaches who are working with our team to ensure that they achieve their leadership potential. We are growing leaders, and it's paying off. We're asking our team to do our work differently than we ever have, to ensure that we are ready for the next 60 years.

### STRONG COMMUNITIES

Okanagan Boys and Girls Clubs is a part of 16 different communities in the Okanagan. In each community, donors and community supporters believe that investing in children and youth pays off, and saves the need for additional expenditures in the future. People generously donate their time, their resources and their money to support our programs and services, and ultimately benefit children and youth in their community.

We have so many things to be grateful for. We have ended the year in a healthy financial position that will allow us to continue to re-invest in our future, and ensure that we are serving the grandchildren of kids who are coming to the club today. We are excited about how far we've come and where we're going. Thank you for being on this journey with us.
